Alternative route

- Non standard training programme for veterinary specialisation
- Increases the possibility for lab animal veterinarians to become specialists

What is the purpose of harmonising specialist training?


- Raising standards for specialist training and animal welfare
- Since research is global, training should be as well

Similarities between alternative routes of all Colleges

- · Requirements for knowledge and skills
- PhD counts for part of the training
- Same certification exam irrespective of training route
- Publication of a scientific paper required

Differences between colleges for the alternative route

- Structure of training
- Duration of training
- Pre-registration requirements
- Supervisor requirement



Conclusions

- Harmonisation does not require the same structure
- More similarities than differences
- Establishing best practices could aid further harmonisation
- Some colleges are restricted by umbrella organisations
- Flexibility in training routes will increase the number of specialists
